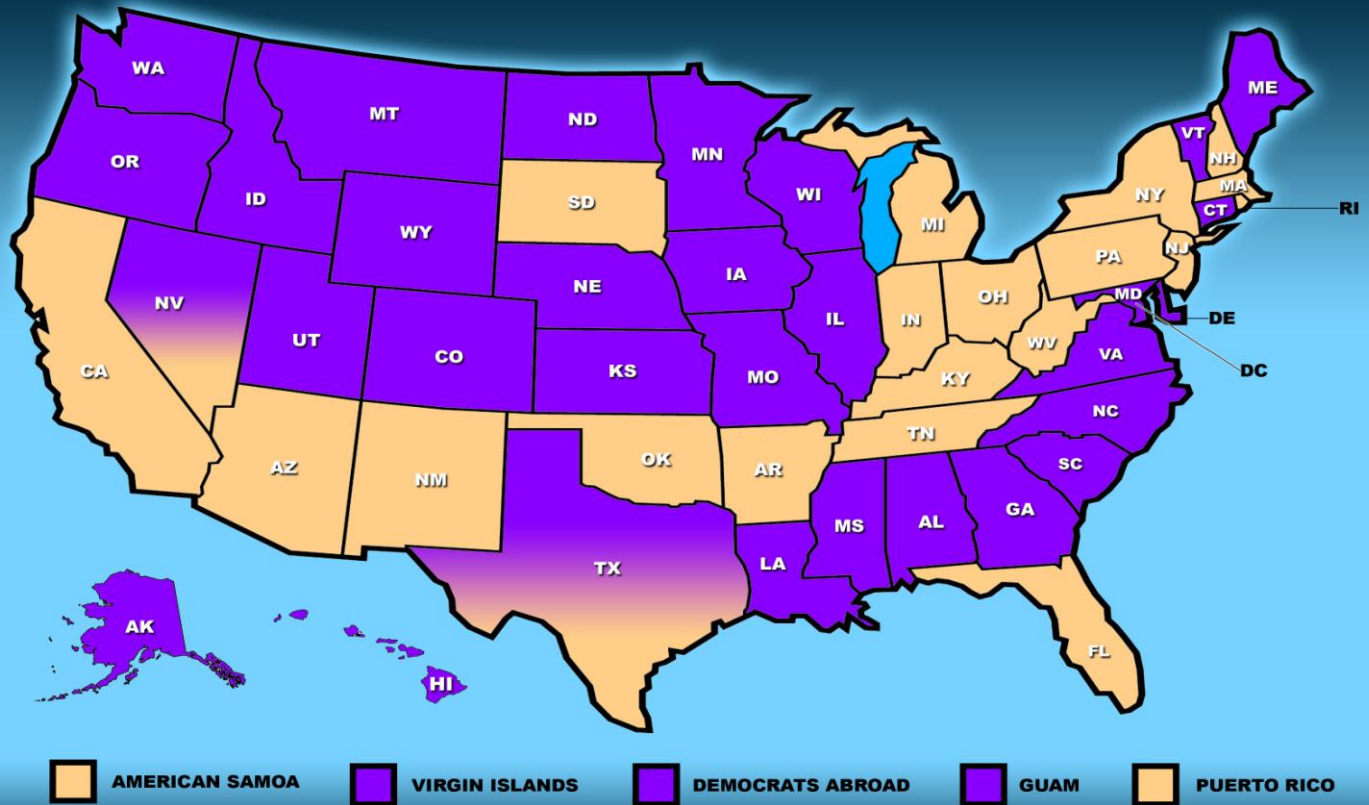

On Wednesday, June 4, 2008, at approximately 7:20pm, it was reported that Senator Hillary Clinton would exit the 2008 Presidential Race on Friday, June 6, 2008. Senator Barack Obama surpassed the delegate threshold on Tuesday, June 3, 2008, during the final Democratic Primary in Montana. On June 4th, 23 House Members and 8 Senators, all strong supporters of Clinton, pressured her to concede to Obama and bring the party together, after she did not acknowledge his historic accomplishment in her speech the previous evening.
